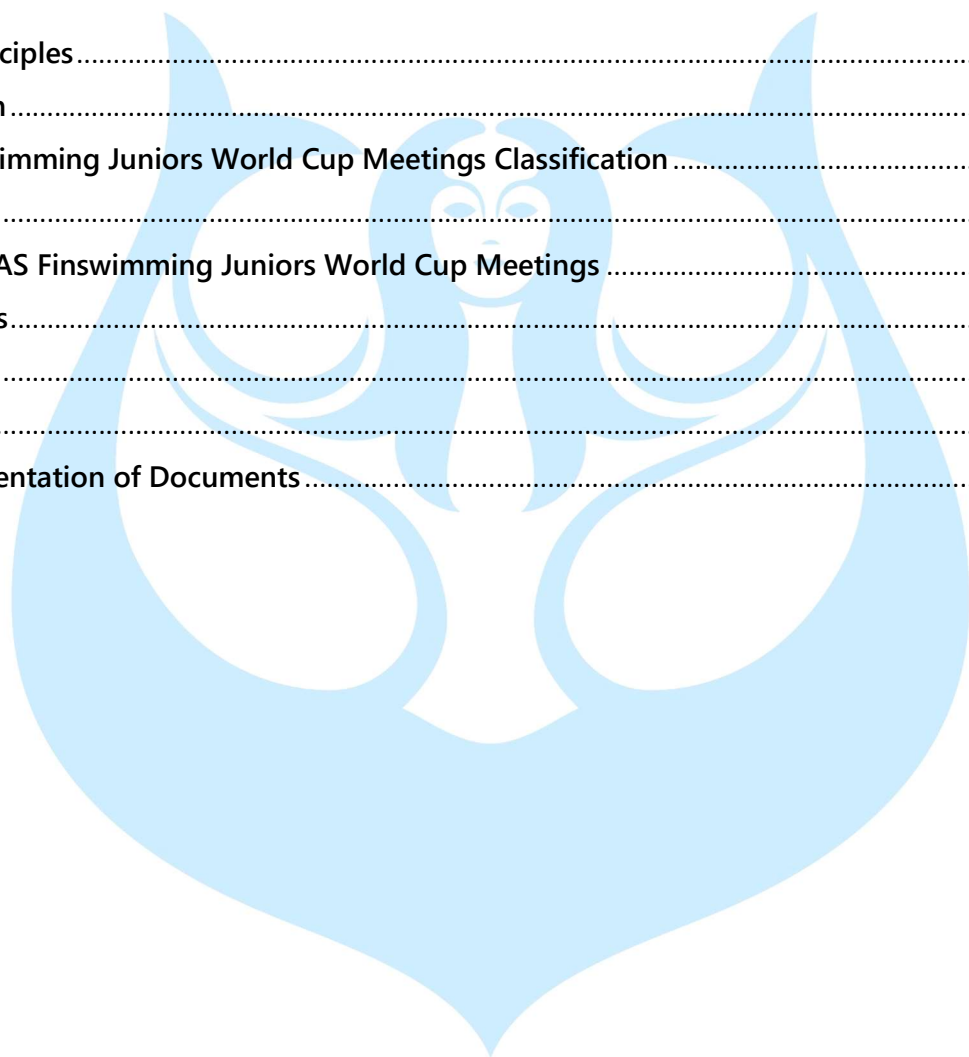

# CMAS

## 1. GENERAL PRINCIPLES

- 1.1. The CMAS General Rules will be applied.
- 1.2. The CMAS Finswimming Juniors World Cup Meetings will include all international invitation swimming-pool meetings that will have been granted a CMAS permit. The calendar of the races of the Cup will be proposed by the CMAS Finswimming Commission (CMAS FC) and will be diffused by the CMAS HQ after BoD vote.
- 1.3. The meetings will undergo an annual CMAS FC evaluation.
- 1.4. The CMAS Finswimming Juniors World Cup Meetings consists of a certain number of rounds.
- 1.5. There must be a minimum gap of three weeks (19 days), between consecutive rounds.
- 1.6. In the CMAS Finswimming Juniors World Cup Meetings, only National Teams and Clubs can participate.
- 1.7. **The Club must send the agreement of their National Federation on a CMAS form application**
- 1.8. The CMAS Finswimming Juniors World Cup Meetings will include:
  - Category C: 14 - 15 years
  - Category D: 12 - 13 years
  - Category E: 11 - 10 years
- 1.9. The CMAS Finswimming Juniors World Cup Meetings will include the following events:
  - **Category C (male & female):**
    - AP/Apnea: 50 m
    - IM/Immersion: 100 m, 200 m
    - SF/Surface: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m,
    - BF/Bi Fins: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m, 400 m
    - Relays: 4X50 m SB (mixed), 4x100 m SF
  - **Category D (male & female):**
    - SF/Surface: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m, 400 m
    - BF/Bi Fins: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m, 400 m
    - Relays: 4X50 m SB (mixed)
  - **Category E (male & female):**
    - SF/Surface: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m
    - BF/Bi Fins: 50 m, 100 m, 200 m
    - Relays: 4X50 m SB (mixed), 4X50 m BF (mixed)
- 1.10. Each competitor can take part in a maximum of four (4) individual races and two (2) relays.
- 1.11. Each competitor can participate for only one Club during the year (*precision: participation in National Team is not considered as participation for a Club. Thus, a competitor has the right to compete during different rounds in the same year for his Club or his national team according the corresponding point in "CMAS general rules"*).
- 1.12. Each National Team or Club can enrol a maximum of four swimmers for each individual race.
- 1.13. A CMAS Finswimming Juniors World Cup Meeting should be staged at one venue during four sessions, see APPENDIX 6.

### MATERIAL RESTRICTIONS

C: 14 - 15 years

- In Surface events athletes can use new-type monofins certified by CMAS. The certification sticker is mandatory.
- Only the use of homologated swimsuits with proper logos is permitted (Women: full body or knee suit. Men: pant, full body, knee suit, jammer).
- The use of snorkel is mandatory in all surface events.

D: 12 - 13 years

- In Surface events athletes can use training monofins, or new-type of monofins with maximum dimensions 60x60 cm which must be certified by CMAS, and carry the certification sticker.
- Only the use of homologated swimsuits with proper logos is permitted (Women: full body or knee suit. Men: pant, full body, knee suit, jammer).
- The use of snorkel is mandatory in all surface events.

E: 10 - 11 years

- In Surface events athletes can use only rubber monofins or Bi Fins.
- The use of competition swimsuits is not permitted.
- The use of snorkel is mandatory in all events.

## 2. **ORGANISATION**

- 2.1. The organiser of a race must have received the National Federation's agreement. It is the National Federation that submits the candidature according to the CMAS rules (before June 30th of previous years).
- 2.2. Every organiser will have to forward the particular regulation with all the necessary information (the price of accommodation etc....) at the latest ten (10) weeks before the event to all the National Federations associated with CMAS and the CMAS HQ. Every National Federation has the responsibility to send the information to its Clubs.
- 2.3. For every meeting, CMAS can send a CMAS Technical Delegate. In that case, the delegate will be in charge of the Organizer.

## 3. **CMAS FINSWIMMING JUNIORS WORLD CUP MEETINGS CLASSIFICATION**

- 3.1. There will be classification for Individuals, Clubs, National Teams and Countries.
- 3.2. Individual: There will be, for every distance, per category men & women. Swimmers registered by Clubs or National Teams are in this classification.
- 3.3. Club: The general classification will be made by the total amount of the individual point (men and women, only registered by clubs). Three separate Club Classification will be made. Overall C – D – E categories, Men C – D – E categories, Women C – D- E categories.
- 3.4. National Teams: The general classification will be made by the total amount of the individual point (men and women, only register by National Teams). Three separate National Teams Classification will be made. Overall C – D – E categories, Men C – D – E categories, Women C – D- E categories.
- 3.5. Countries Ranking:
  - 3.5.1. The Countries Ranking will be made in accordance with points **Σφάλμα! Το αρχείο προέλευσης της αναφοράς δεν βρέθηκε.** and 1.12 by the total amount of the individual

points (C – D – E categories, men and women) of National Teams.

3.5.2. If a National Federation does not enrol its National team, the best two results by club in accordance with points **Σφάλμα! Το αρχείο προέλευσης της αναφοράς δεν βρέθηκε.** and 1.12 at each distance, at each category (C – D – E categories, men & woman,) will go for the Countries ranking.

3.6. For every race of the CMAS Finswimming Juniors World Cup Meetings, the classification will be according the following CMAS Swimming-Pool Individual Point Table:

All other swimmers who finish the race will receive 1 point for successful participation.

#### 4. **AWARDS**

4.1. For every round of the World Cup Meeting (in charge of the organizer):

- Gold, silver and bronze medals for each distance. Per event and category men and women
- The first Club and National teams of the overall, men and women classifications will receive a cup.
- All participant Clubs and National Teams will receive an award.

#### 5. **ENTRY TO CMAS FINSWIMMING JUNIORS WORLD CUP MEETINGS**

5.1. A preliminary Entry Form must be sent to the Organizer and to the CMAS HQ at the latest 6 weeks before the event.

5.2. After this deadline, a penalty will be applied from organizing committee.

5.3. The final registration must be done on the Sportdata website

5.4. Withdrawal can be announced not later than 5 days before the competition.

5.5. A 50,00 Euro fee will be paid to the organizer for a swimmer who declares withdrawal after this time.

#### 6. **CMAS RIGHTS**

6.1. Competitions are organised under the exclusive control of CMAS, and all rights are and will be the property of CMAS.

#### 7. **RESULTS**

7.1. The Organizer must:

- Give one copy of the results to all National Teams and Clubs.
- Send one copy of the results to the CMAS HQ.
- Upload a copy in the appropriate format to SportData for archival purposes.

## 8. **PROTEST**

8.1. CMAS Rules will be applied.

## 9. **OFFICIAL PRESENTATION OF DOCUMENTS**

For all documents (start lists and results), the presentation must be:

- In one of the three languages of CMAS, only
- According to the following examples:

You must add the name of the country (IOC format conform) before the name of the Club:
